PEEK INTO OUR CLASSROOM

Devotions: Gerrit on 2/1; A'laysia on 2/8

Reading: Students are learning more about informational text by reading their own animal book. This week we will look at fact and opinion as well as cause and effect as we read.

Writing: We will learn to write multiple paragraphs about a topic and the difference between topic and supporting sentences.

Bible: Focus is on the stories of God Hears Hagar & Ishmael and Abraham's Testing. Then we will prepare for a test on Friday.

Math: 3rd: Continue to look at place value in decimals and then review for a test on Thursday.
