### PEEK INTO OUR CLASSROOM

**Reading:** We will continue our reading of *Frindle* this week. Students will use a timeline to look at main events and work on expanding our vocabulary with words in the text.

**Writing:** Students will be writing endings, revising, and rewriting their important person narratives.

**Bible:** Focus is on testing our skills at using the Bible to look up verses, use the concordance, find footnotes and locate places on the Bible maps.

**Math:** 3<sup>rd</sup>: Focus is on using methods of subtraction and adding/subtracting multi-digits.

**Math** 4<sup>th</sup>: Today they will take a test on multi-digit addition and subtraction as well as organizing data. We will begin our new unit on multiplication, division & algebra with a look at the multiplication number table.

**Social Studies:** Students will create a map of Michigan to show what they have learned about its geography.

**Science:** We will begin our first science unit by discussing what it means to be a scientist.

**Bible:** Memorize Psalm 119:9-12 by Wed., Oct. 18<sup>th</sup>.


3<sup>rd</sup> **Math:** HL 2.5 & 2.6 due on Wed.

### SKILL CORNER—MATH WAR

Playing games is a great way to learn math facts. All you need is a deck of cards and knowledge of how to play a traditional game of card war. Shuffle the deck of cards and each player takes two cards. You can either add, subtract, or multiply the two cards in your hand. Whoever has the higher number wins and takes each player's cards and sets these aside. At the end of the game, add up the cards you've collected and whoever has the most wins the game. Make it a little more challenging by having each player take four cards and create two-two digit numbers, then add, subtract, or multiply the numbers in their hand. Again the person with the highest number wins. You can use an Ace as 1, the Jack as a 10, Queen as 11, and King as 12 or take the face cards out if your child isn't quite ready for these yet. Have fun learning math!
